In a giant swamp one day

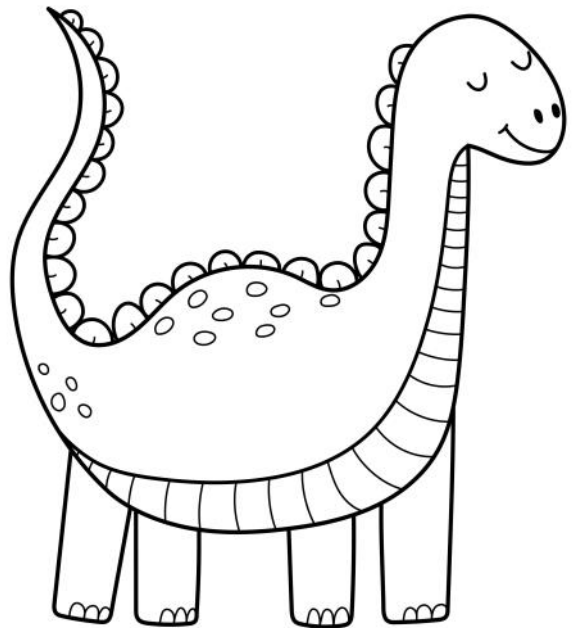
They had such enormous fun

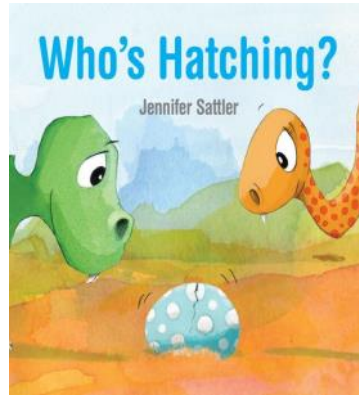
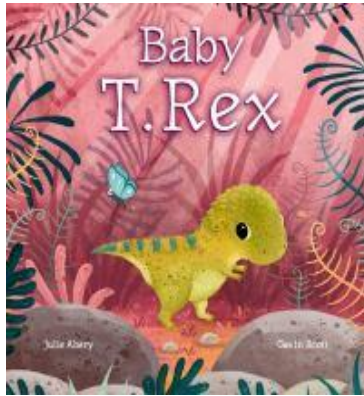

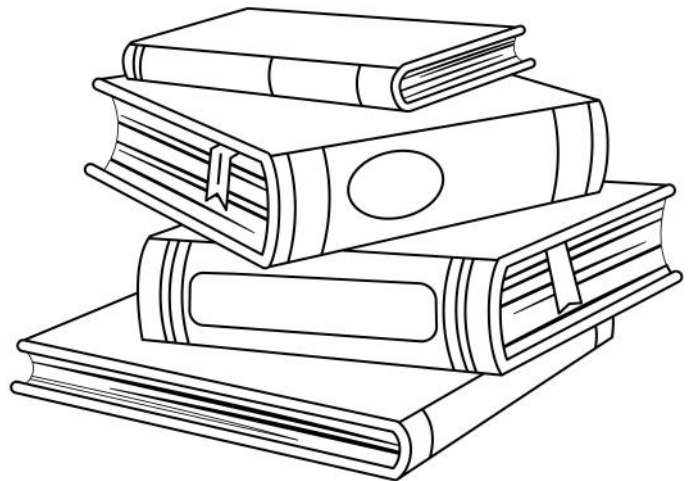
